Advice Regarding Hay & Straw Thefts

Further to our previous message concerning the increase in the number of thefts of bails of hay and straw from fields and barns across the county, farmers and livery yards are asked not only to report any thefts and be aware of vehicles seen in suspicious circumstances, but to **mark the twine on their bails** in a unique way where possible. Police patrols have been tasked to stop vehicles seen carrying bails at night, unfortunately one bail looks like any other and any help in identifying where it came from would be useful. We do appreciate that for many large scale farmers this will prove to be a very difficult request.

Criminal Activity – The Mount, Ifield Police Serials 839 of 16/8, 536 of 20/8 & 541 of 24/8

The Mount at Ifield has had a series of criminal activity reported recently including fences and locks on gates being cut, outbuildings being entered and a burglary where power tools and fishing equipment was stolen.

Please bear in mind that crime does increase at this time of year now crops have been cut.

There has been an increased number of unexplained injuries to horses in both the Dorset area and bordering county of Hampshire. In the past some of the injuries have been put down to rutting stags at this time of year, however some are more sinister. Please report any suspicious activity to the police. Dorset police are currently auditing all Watch members and will segregate Horse Watch from Farm Watch. Members will be able to receive both Watch messages if required but this will enable us to get specific messages across to Horse watch members and, hopefully, improve the service. Please note that unlike some other Forces this is not assigned to a dedicated officer but has to be done in addition to normal police duties.

A message to all horse owners to warn of a marked increase, especially in the East Dorset area, in the number of electric fencing units being stolen. Please mark your property well which is a deterrent to the thief and helps us to identify any stolen items.

Abandoned equines on private land – what can be done?

We occasionally receive reports of horses being apparently abandoned in privately owned fields or common land and are asked what can be done.

An abandoned equine is a particularly difficult situation to resolve. Until it has been proved that an animal is truly abandoned and not just stray or escaped, the owner has to be given a chance to come forward and claim their animal before alternative arrangements can be made.

If the animal is on common land contact the local parish and borough council to ascertain if there are commoners rights to grazing is permitted on the land. If not, then they will take the necessary action to rectify.

If a horse has been put onto private land without permission initially it must be established that the horse(s) has indeed been abandoned.

If it is in a poor condition contact one of the horse welfare charities, such as Redwings, the BHS or the World Horse Welfare, who will be able to discuss options with you. However, if the horse is in good condition removal of the horse is beyond the jurisdiction of welfare agencies and would need to be dealt with as a civil matter.

Many abandoned or stray animals are found wandering on roads. As public highways are under the direct control of the police, any animal found on a roadway should be reported to the police straightaway to reduce the risk of a serious accident. The police will often deal with the problem by putting a stray animal into the nearest field, which removes the hazard caused by the stray animal, but can cause a subsequent problem for the landowner.

If you find an abandoned equine on your land, remember that it may well be frightened and should not be approached unless necessary. Always offer the equine some fresh water and, if possible, contain them in a place where they can graze safely, then take the following steps:

If you can, look to see if the equine has a freezemark. If it does, make a note of the mark and contact Farmkey on 01295 252544 or Freezemark Ltd on 01295 690090. Also it is now law for all new foals to be microchipped so it's checking to see if the horse has a microchip (all vets have a microchip scanner); this can then be checked against NED or the Petlog databases.

Look for signs of active care such as being shod, clipped, having a hogged mane, trimmed tail or trimmed whiskers which indicate that there is an active owner who will be looking for their escapee as soon as their absence is noted. If the equine has poor conformation or looks underweight, unkempt or elderly DO NOT assume that the animal is not wanted and cared for, but bear in mind that it might have been deliberately abandoned.

Report the abandonment to the police. Any escaped or stolen equine will normally have been reported to them. Ask for an incident number when you speak to them and keep a note of it for future reference.

Report the abandonment to the RSPCA. Although they do not always get involved directly, Inspectors may have or discover relevant information. If the equine is in poor condition or there is any sign of injury, make sure the RSPCA are aware of this.

If there is still no sign of an owner, you will need to put up an Abandonment Notice for a minimum of 14 days. This will notify passers-by that the equine has been abandoned and give the owner a reasonable period of time to come forward. The notice will state that if no owner is found, the animal may be legally rehomed or sold. It is good practice to issue another 7 day notice if no owner comes forward within the initial two week period.

. Fill in the details appropriately, protect the notice from the elements (eg. wrap it in a clear plastic bag) and display it prominently at the gate to the field or yard where the equine has been found. It is not necessary to keep the equine where it was found, or for it to be kept where you display the notice. It can also be useful to put up a card in local tack shops, supermarket and post office or put a notice in the local Free Ads.

Keep copies of all notices that you put up and notes of where you put them and for how long. If no owner comes forward after the horse has been rehomed, you will need to prove that you followed all procedures correctly and made a significant effort to find the owner of the horse. If you can do this, your actions will be protected by the law. It is also recommend that a diary of events is kept, as it is much harder to try and recollect events later on.

Many equines that are thought to be abandoned are owned by people who do not have their own land. These animals have not usually been abandoned and the use of an abandonment notice often results in the equine disappearing as suddenly as it appeared. If someone claiming to be the owner approaches you, it is advisable to ask to see the horse passport that they should, by law, have in their possession. This will prevent someone fraudulently claiming the horse. The passport will contain a detailed description of the equine that can be checked against the abandoned animal.

If no owner comes forward within the defined period, by law you are able to take legal responsibility for the equine. This allows someone to sell, re-home, euthanize or keep the horse or pony. The current difficulty with acquiring an equine in this way is the absence of their passport, which is a legal requirement and essential if you want to sell the animal or need to have it treated by a vet. Under the passport system it is not straightforward to issue a passport for an equine which should already have one and you will need to contact DEFRA for advice on this issue. Their helpline number is 08459 33 55 77.

Whatever course of action you decide to take, it is imperative to keep records of money spent or received, expenses incurred and actions taken (such as veterinary treatment, vaccinations, worming and so on) for several months afterwards.

There will always be the remote possibility that an owner comes forward in the future wishing to reclaim the horse (if the horse has been stolen before it was abandoned, they may have spent months looking for their equine). Here the law becomes even more complex and if an agreement with the owner cannot be reached, you may need to take legal advice to resolve the situation satisfactorily.

To minimise the risk of animals being abandoned on your land, always keep gates securely locked.
